
The Society's purpose is "to bring together those people interested in the history of the City of Long Beach and to coordinate their efforts in preserving and recording that history for future generations."

Shades of Mississippi Military History

The great state of Mississippi has had no shortage of men who served in times of need. The names of 71 men from Mississippi are listed as having served in the Revolutionary War which took place between 1775 and 1783. About 80,000 Mississippi men fought in the Civil War and of those, about 8,000 lost their lives. Some of the sources of information admit that many muster rolls were destroyed before exact counts could be taken so these are the best estimates.

There were many coast men who lost their lives in WWI, from Pearlington to Pascagoula and other nearby small towns also; Logtown, Vancleave, Lucedale, and Wiggins. Making the ultimate sacrifice from Long Beach was one man, Private Luke Jefferson.

a young black husband and father, barely in his thirties. He was from a large family and left many siblings.

Many WWII monuments are in existence so those numbers are available to all and we do know that 11 men from Long Beach lost their lives in that war.

Statistics also say that 14 men from Harrison county lost their lives in the Korean War. Four of

Hurricane Anniversary Event

A standing-room only audience attended the August 29 Program "Patchwork and Tales: "Two Women Reflect on Hurricane Katrina" at the Katrina Research Center at USM Gulf Coast.

The Long Beach Historical Society co-sponsored the Katrina Anniversary event with the Research Center.

Greetings were extended to all by Dr Deanne Nuwer, Center Director and Dr Frances Lucas, Vice President and Executive Officer of USMGC

David Wells, husband of the late Solveig Wells, related how his wife became involved in creating quilts from remnants found after Hurricane Katrina.

Claire Boggs Morrison, age 98 and a member of our society, recalled her experiences living at Boggsdale during four hurricanes, 1915, (was there but too young to remember) 1947, 1969 and 2005. Mrs. Morrison was assisted with her presentation by a niece Eleanor Shoemaker. "The 1947 hurricane was the most terrifying of all the storms and Camille disrupted a wedding reception at Boggsdale," she declared. "We all evacuated to the old Edgewater Gulf Hotel where we enjoyed the last bottle of champagne from the wedding as the storm raged!"

Following the recollections, Dr Louis Kyriakoudes, director of the Center for Oral History and Cultural Heritage explained the significance of oral histories and the work he has underway.

After closing remarks by Dr Lucas, conclusion of the program followed refreshments and fellowship.


